VACCINE REQUIREMENTS FOR IN-PERSON PARTICIPANTS IN ARTS FOR ALL WISCONSIN PROGRAMS Effective as of January 5, 2022

To help ensure that everyone remains healthy, ARTS for ALL Wisconsin requires all staff and participants of in-person programming to be fully vaccinated to the extent they are eligible. Proof of vaccination must be provided within 14 days of class or program start date. If proof of being fully vaccinated as eligible is not provided, onsite/in-person participation will not be allowed. Masks are required for all who can wear them regardless of vaccination status during in-person programs.

“Fully vaccinated as eligible” means

- it has been at least two weeks since receiving a 1-dose vaccine—such as Johnson & Johnson, **OR**
- it has been at least two weeks since second dose of a 2-dose vaccine—such as Moderna and Pfizer,

AND

- a booster or an additional dose once eligible has been completed.
- Eligibility as of 1/5/2022 is
 - two months after Johnson & Johnson **OR**
 - six months after second dose of Pfizer/Moderna
 - Note that other health conditions may make you eligible sooner.
 - You must present proof of being fully vaccinated to AFA staff to be able to participate in onsite/in-person classes or programs within 14 days of the start of the class or program. [Please upload proof of vaccination status here.](#)

If proof of full vaccination status as eligible cannot be provided, onsite/in-person participation will not be allowed. A VIEW-ONLY LIVESTREAM option is also available, as a stand-alone choice or for In-Person participants unable to attend classes due to illness, transportation issues, weather, et cetera. If you choose to join an in-person class, rest assured that you can join the livestream of the class remotely if you need to.
