Overview of Achievements

Between July 1, 2017 and June 30, 2018, VSA Wisconsin programming directly served over 1,000 individuals across the age spectrum and across all disability categories including physical, emotional, learning, behavioral, and intellectual. An additional 200,000 individuals were engaged through special events, art exhibitions and concerts throughout the state of Wisconsin – and thousands more in our nation's capitol!

Especially notable VSA programming from the last year includes our annual Call for Art, Free to Be Me, a dance collaboration in Stevens Point, Vets' Art Studios in Madison and Wausau, and our participation in the National Christmas Tree celebration in Washington D.C.

Call for Art and Statewide Traveling Exhibition

Each year, VSA Wisconsin invites submissions of artwork from Wisconsin residents with disabilities ages 5 and up. Historically, hundreds of submissions are received from all age groups (young children to octogenarians) in a wide variety of media of both two- and three-dimensional visual art work. All artists who submit work are displayed in Visual Expressions: A Call for Art Exhibition at the VSA Wisconsin Art Center and Gallery in Madison during April that culminates in a public reception in early May. All entries are juried by arts professionals who look for creativity, originality, and craftsmanship. Jurors select ten artworks that will be added to Creative Power, VSA Wisconsin's Traveling Exhibition. The visual art exhibition provides public recognition of hundreds of individuals with disabilities at the Call for Art Event.

National Christmas Tree

Ornaments by Wisconsin artists with disabilities dazzled President's Park (White House) in Washington, D.C. as part of the 95th annual National Christmas Tree Lighting display. Using pine cones, beads, glitter and paint, artists participating in VSA Wisconsin programs created ornaments that showcased their talents and the pride they have in our beautiful state.

The handcrafted ornaments adorned one of 56 trees representing each U.S. state, territory and the District of Columbia from December 1, 2017 through January 1, 2018 as part of the America Celebrates display.

"It was an honor to be among the organizations chosen to help our nation celebrate the holidays in one of our most recognizable national parks," says Kathie Wagner, past President of VSA Wisconsin. "We were excited to be a part of the America Celebrates display because it showcases the talents of artists with disabilities and encourages them to continue pursuing their creative dreams."

The unique ornaments were created in classes conducted at the VSA Wisconsin Art Center. Many ornaments feature the winter scenes so familiar to Wisconsinites. One salutes the state's contribution to the armed forces. Several others depict the University of Wisconsin's beloved Bucky mascot – and the famous 'cheeseheads' for which the state is known.

VSA Wisconsin's Vets' Art Studios were formed in partnership with the Veterans Centers in Madison and Wausau to provide art-making experiences to veterans with disabilities. Over the past year, twenty-one Vets' Art Studio participants have dedicated over one hundred hours to art-making. The veterans consider their artwork a version of therapy and way of coping with life stressors and military trauma.

"I'm really happy and honored to be able to share and instruct these vets," says Vets' Studio Wausau teaching artist David Hummer. "And at the same time give them a chance to get to know each other better." Developing a sense of trust by engaging in a collaborative project with men and women working closely together and being comfortable in doing so was a notable outcome of the program. One participant reported that it renewed and expanded their sense of trust in others

while improving their overall sense of safety. Several participants have expressed that doing art gives them a healthy coping skill and allows them to be focused on something that brings them joy and a sense of peace to their life during their healing process.

Bucky on Parade

VSA Wisconsin's Vets' Art Studio participated in the community-wide Bucky on Parade project, providing a tremendous source of pride to vets in 2018. Bucky on Parade was a free public art event featuring 85 Bucky Badger statues throughout Madison and Dane County from May through September 2018. Local and regional artists transformed the Bucky statues into unique works of art. The VSA Wisconsin Vets' Art Studio Bucky, "Full Fatigues," sponsored by TDS, resided at the Wisconsin Veterans Museum in Madison. "It has led to opportunities for them to speak out at public places about their time in service," says Jennifer Sluga of Madison Vet Center. "Art has helped them heal because when some of the Vietnam Vets came home they felt isolated and now they are getting the chance to feel accepted in public."

"Full Fatigues" Bucky brought in \$23,000 for the Garding Against Cancer campaign of the University of Wisconsin and the Wisconsin Foundation and Alumni Association and Greg and Michelle Garding to raise funds and awareness for cancer research and care in the state of Wisconsin.

Free to Be Me

Free to Be Me, a collaborative program between VSA Wisconsin and Point Dance Ensemble studio in Stevens Point, was launched in the summer of 2017, creating an innovative opportunity for young dancers with disabilities to be mentored by and perform with more experienced dancers from Point Dance Ensemble. This nine-month project led by VSA Teaching Artist Angie Nyquist culminated with performances on March 2-4, 2018. Several parents were concerned that their child's disabilities were so significant that they would be denied entry to the program. VSA staff assured them that any child with a disability that wanted to participate could do so. VSA believes that art doesn't see disability, and Free to Be Me has welcomed all the children with disabilities. Nine children with disabilities, ages 6-12, participated in the program.

The effects of this project live on not only in wonderful memories, but also in the hearts of the High School aged mentors who learned about opening themselves up to others who seem different from themselves.

VSA Billboards

A highlight of 2018 was a series of billboards generously created and donated by Adams Outdoor in 2018. The billboards featured joyful VSA participants engaged in one of the many artistic mediums taught by our amazing teaching staff. Every day these vibrant billboards greeted thousands of people throughout Dane County while promoting our guiding philosophy: Art doesn't see disability.

Free to Be Me inspired further creative exploration as well as lasting friendships. "The collaboration between Point Dance Ensemble and VSA Wisconsin has offered the company members and community dancers a space to expand relationships beyond the dance studio or classroom," Pamela Luedtke, Artistic Director of Point Dance Ensemble, says. Laura Wertjes, one of the dancers involved in this project, is working with Angie Nyquist and the Point Dance Ensemble on another project. Laura, paired with a dancer from Point Dance Ensemble
